Mobile Library Bus

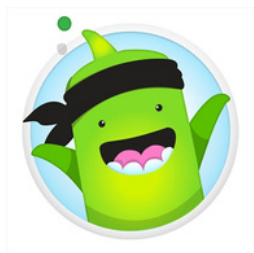

Mon 14th April - Easter Holiday Begins. School closed.

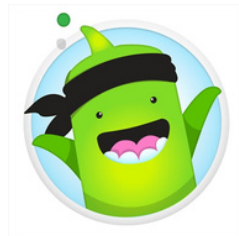
Absences

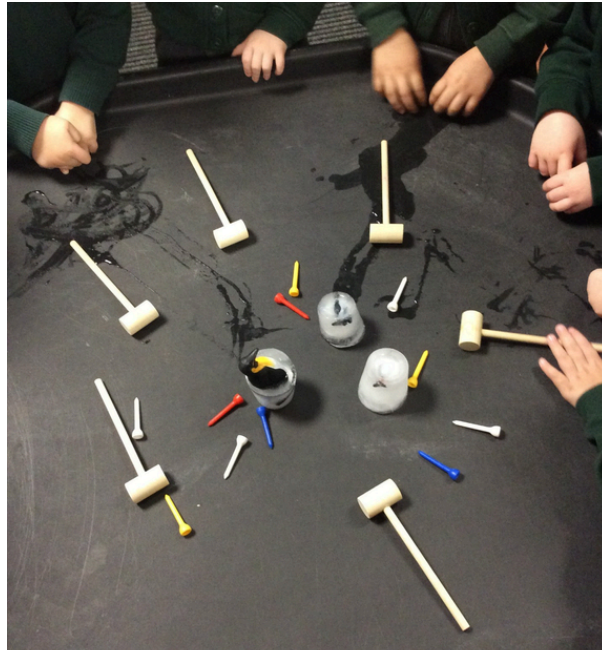

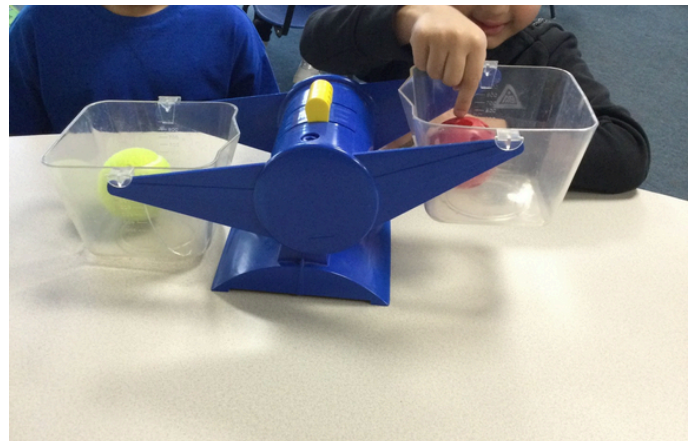
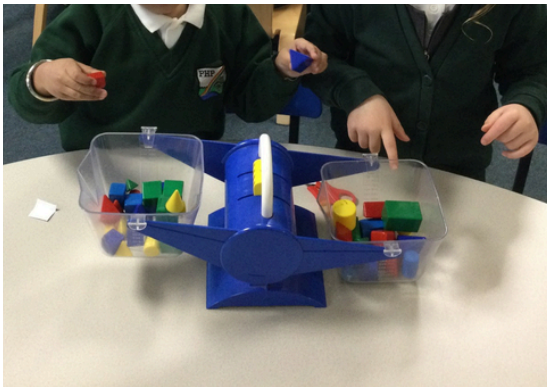

The children have been inspired, challenged and have definitely been learning!



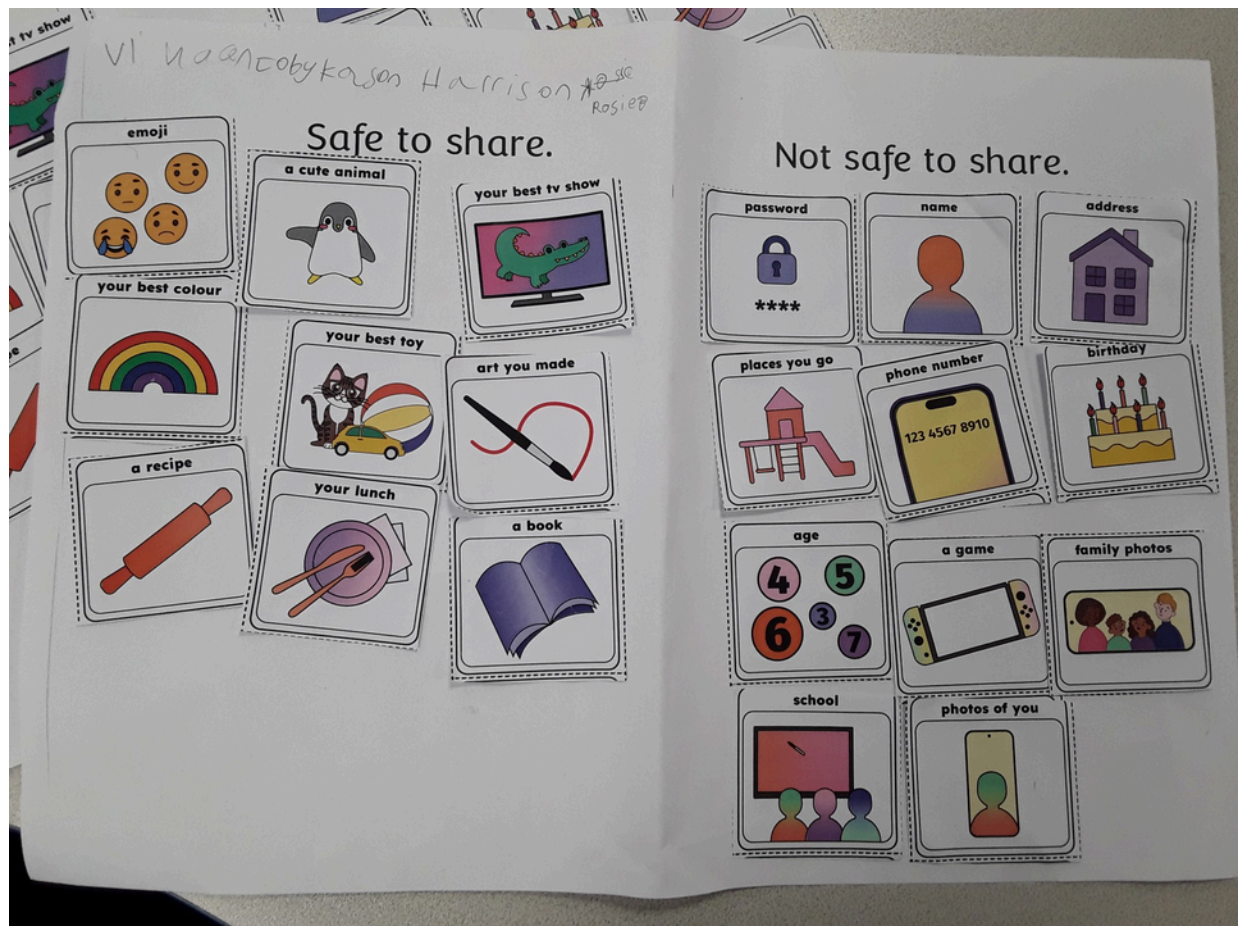
Our Nursery children have been learning exploring ice this week, how it is made and how it melts. We had to rescue the penguins trapped in the ice because it was too cold.



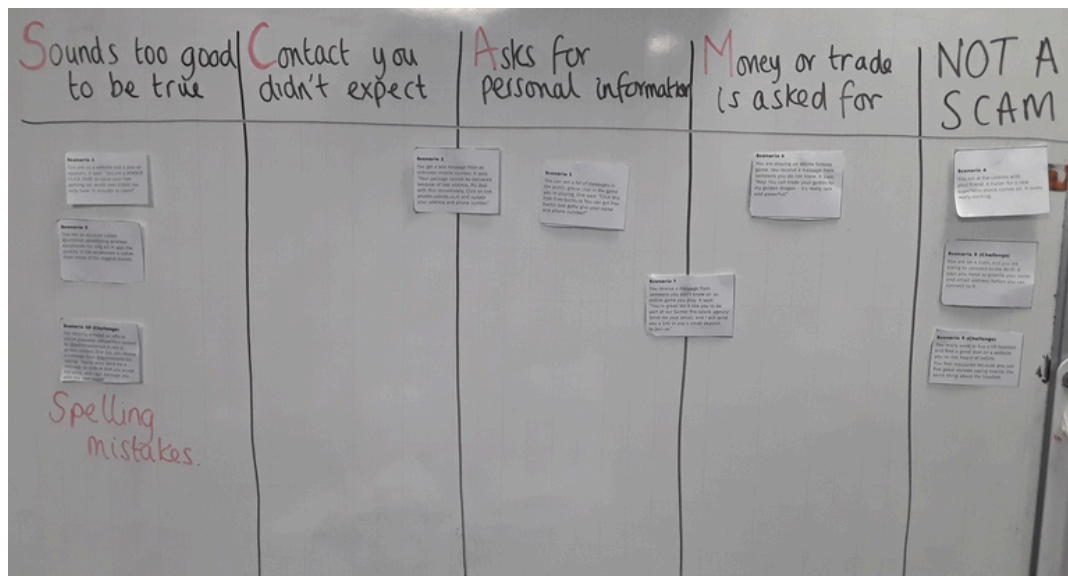
Reception children have been enjoyed exploring weight this week in Power Maths. They have been finding the heavier and the lighter objects.
