



The children have been inspired, challenged and have definitely been learning!




Our Nursery children have been enjoying the story of the 3 Billy Goats Gruff. We have worked hard to sort out the goats using big, medium and small as a size criteria.





Reception children have been using five frames to find doubles and they have done really well!




Our Year 1 children have been comparing two poems, look at the similarities and differences between the two in English this week.






Our Year 2 children have been looking at extracts from Samuel Pepys diary to find out more about the Great Fire of London.
