Samples of This Week's Work


The children have been inspired, challenged and have definitely been learning!



Our Nursery children have been very excited! As well as our amazing visit to the Sea Life Centre the children have been learning all about The Gingerbread Man. They have loved running around pretending to be the gingerbread man. We explored the trim trail for the first time pretending to be the gingerbread man escaping!
