

Our Nursery children have loved learning all about under the sea and particularly enjoyed retelling the story of Tiddler.




Reception children had their Inspire Workshop this week and made their own rainbow fish




Our Year 1 children have been learning about the Sikh celebration Vaisakhi. They enjoyed learning a dance that is sometimes performed during the celebration.



Our Year 2 children have enjoyed using the glockenspiels in our music lesson.


