

Our Nursery children have been investigating rolling using their autumn objects. They found out what rolled the fastest and what would slide instead of roll down the ramp.










Our reception children have been exploring Diwali this week. They particularly liked making their own mehndi patterns using cotton buds and black paint on hand templates.
